Completed Vehicle Manufacturer - a manufacturer of vehicles that require no further manufacturing operations to perform their intended function

**Incomplete Vehicle Manufacturer** - a manufacturer of incomplete vehicles. Incomplete vehicle means an assemblage consisting, at a minimum, of chassis (including the frame) structure, power train, steering system, suspension system, and braking system, in the state that those systems are to be part of the completed vehicle, but requires further manufacturing operations to become a completed vehicle. Also means an incomplete trailer.

Intermediate Vehicle Manufacturer - a manufacturer (other than the incomplete vehicle manufacturer or final-stage manufacturer) who performs manufacturing operations on a vehicle manufactured in two or more stages.

Final-Stage Vehicle Manufacturer - a manufacturer who performs such manufacturing operations on an incomplete vehicle that it becomes a completed vehicle

Vehicle Alterer - a person who alters by addition, substitution, or removal of components (other than readily attachable components), a certified vehicle before the first purchase of the vehicle other than for resale

Fabricating Manufacturer of Motor Vehicle Equipment - a person that manufacturers or assembles motor vehicle equipment

Importer of Motor Vehicle Equipment - a person that imports motor vehicle equipment for resale

**Importer of Motor Vehicles Originally Manufactured to Conform to FMVSS** - a person that imports motor vehicles originally manufactured to conform to FMVSS for resale as distinguished from registered importers subject to the duties specified in 49 CFR Part 592

**Replica Vehicle Manufacturer** - a manufacturer that is registered as a replica motor vehicle pursuant to 49 CFR Part 586. (This selection should also be made by prospective replica manufacturers prior to submitting Part 586 registration information. If your Part 586 registration is approved, NHTSA will notify you that your 566 has been updated with your status as a replica vehicle manufacturer. Once your 566 submission is accepted, you will be notified to submit 586 application.)
